

#### Teaching Practitioner Status Training Programme, June



Congratulations to the first cohort of Cheshire and Merseyside Social Working Teaching Practitioners!

The programme comprised a series of half-day workshops that focused on key subjects/issues that face individuals who are new to teaching in higher education including those in roles where supporting learning is a small part of their work. The workshops provided an opportunity to discuss experiences, share ideas and gain some information about a range of techniques that may help in teaching. Workshops included; Planning for Learning, Microteaching Preparation, Working with Large Groups, Small Group Teaching, Introduction to Assessment and Marking, and Microteaching.

The Interim Evaluation was received May 2019. Many positives were identified including:

- Consistency and rigour to the admissions process with a refined process

- Academics into Practice
- Practitioners into HEI's
- Teacher Practitioner training and status
- Career Pathway Opportunities Framework

A number of things for the partnership to review, confirm or consider were also identified. These included current payments to SU to ensure their contribution at the Partnership Board, further improving whole organization commitment e.g. strategic decision makers present at meetings, equal engagement of partners, partners cascading info, and partners only agreeing to something if can deliver on it.

The workshops and focus groups for the final evaluation of the partnership will take place 14<sup>th</sup> – 17<sup>th</sup> October 2019.
