Practitioner Research Conference



The partnership held its first Practitioner Research Conference on 20th September in the Conference Centre at L.A.C.E. The themes of the day were:

- What constitutes practitioner/practice based research and the various research methods used
- Current opportunities and challenges in shaping research for Social Workers in our Local Authorities, Trusts, PVI's and Higher Education Institutions
- Identifying potential research ideas and themes

The day was well attended and the presentations and talks were "challenging", "thought-provoking" and "inspiring". The day culminated in a lively panel discussion with great engagement from the room. Attendees left the conference with a renewed energy for the role of research within Social Work practice.
